

Colorectal cancer - Early diagnosis course



Overview

This course assists primary care staff in effectively assessing and managing patients with a potential colorectal cancer diagnosis. You will be presented with interactive video consultations introducing Simon Jenkins, aged 38, who visits his GP with abdominal symptoms. These are accompanied by a range of activities to reinforce key learning points.

This course will support you to:

- Identify a number of, often uncertain, symptoms that can be associated with colorectal cancer
- Understand the importance of a rectal examination and what necessitates a referral
- Recognise that younger patients can present with symptoms and should be investigated despite their age
- Confidently assess the need for referral in accordance with NICE NG12 guidelines
