

Lung cancer - End of life course



Overview

This course supports health professionals who are working with patients approaching the end of their life, and their families. You will be presented with interactive video consultations based on Fred who has been diagnosed with late stage lung cancer and his wife, Vera. These are accompanied by a range of activities to reinforce key learning points.

This course will support you to:

- Enable patients to effectively articulate their symptoms and concerns and support them appropriately
- Initiate conversations around death and dying including practical aspects of advanced care planning
- Manage symptoms such as breathlessness and pain (including use of morphine)

Specialist interviews include

- Dr David Waterman, Consultant in Palliative Care, discussing a patient entering the last stages of life
- Reverend Andrew Bradley, Chaplaincy Co-ordinator, discussing the importance of carers and families conversing with the patient about their wishes for their own care
