

Lymphoma - Early diagnosis course



Overview

This course assists primary care staff who are working with patients facing a possible lymphoma diagnosis. You will be presented with interactive video consultations introducing Sophie Rushton, aged 22, as she describes her symptoms to her GP. These are accompanied by a range of activities to reinforce key learning points.

- Recognise and effectively monitor a neck lump and other red flag symptoms
- Evaluate the most appropriate investigations and assess the need for referral in accordance with NICE NG12 guidelines
- Explore how to talk honestly about referral with patients and how to support them through the process
