

Myeloma - Early diagnosis course



Overview

This course aims to assist primary care staff who are working with patients facing a possible myeloma diagnosis. You will be presented with interactive video consultations introducing June Taylor, aged 77, who visits her GP for a routine medication review for her arthritis. These are accompanied by a range of activities to reinforce key learning points.

This course will support you to:

- Recognise common myeloma indicators, such as hypercalcaemia and renal dysfunction
- Distinguishing concerning pain from common back pain in patients
- Effectively monitor patients who have been diagnosed with MGUS
- Confidently assess the need for referral in accordance with NICE NG12 guidelines
